

Support engagement with "missing generations" including children and young people

Last September I introduced myself as working for our circuit via the District **One Opportunity Programme**. This programme runs from September to August and is open to anyone aged 16-23 who would like to join. Speak to Vic Loveday at District if you are interested.



The internship is designed to encourage, recognise and reward

the participation of young people within the District in the Church's life and mission. It gives them the opportunity to be involved on a part – time basis of three hours a week in the development of the mission and ministry of their churches or local areas.

At the moment in the Sheffield District there are three interns, Faye, Coni, and myself. We are currently working on projects that will enhance the life and mission of young people in churches or their local community. The **ONE Programme** enables all three interns to work out their discipleship in new and different ways.

All interns are asked to go to an introduction day to meet the other interns and to learn about what they do. There are also some residential days such as a weekend in Scarborough at the Emmaus Centre where we spent a lot of time thinking about the future and how we can have an impact. We are expected to participate in district days out as well such as the escape room in York which was followed by learning about climate change, disability in church and learning about our other churches in the connexion.

My project is a **new youth group** in **Barnsley Circuit** on the **third Wednesday of each month** at **5:30pm** before contemporary worship at **Emmanuel**. It is called the **'Missing Generation'** Group. It is open to anyone who is aged 14-18 as I believe this is the most crucial age for a young Christian. This is the age where youth become young adults and they are beginning to turn to Christ. We should nurture and guide them along that new path.

We start our group with prayer and a game, which is then followed by our main activity. In March our theme was about leading, our young people split into groups to plan a youth group or a church service. We then came back together to share ideas. Suggestions included modern songs rather than hymns so new people would be more interested in joining in. And the youth group suggestions were that they wanted to lead a session themselves. Another game followed discussions and we ended in prayer. There are always snacks such as crisps or chocolates and drinks.



I hope that even when my time as an intern ends, I will still have the time to keep running this group, the numbers are small at the moment but they are growing. This group is full of friends and we learn about the bible in an easy way.

Raise awareness across the Circuit of opportunities for service and engagement, especially through external groups seeking to meet the needs of local people.

Fostering plays a vital role in providing a lifeline to children and young people who, for various reasons, cannot remain with their birth families. Such circumstances may include parental health issues, family breakdowns, or situations that pose a risk to the child's safety. By stepping into this gap, foster care offers these young individuals a stable and nurturing environment, ensuring they receive care and support they need while permanent solutions are sought for their well-being.

Thousands of children in the UK are in need of **foster care** at any given time. The diversity of needs means a significant demand for a wide range of **fostering** placements, from emergency and short-term care to long-term and specialist **fostering**. There is also a need for **foster carers** from diverse backgrounds to better match the diversity of the children in care. There is no 'typical' **foster carer**. People from all walks of life, with a variety of life experiences, skills, and backgrounds, can potentially foster if they have the capacity to care for and make a difference in a child's life. You do need to be beyond your 21st birthday.

Fostering is not just about providing a bed for a child; it's about offering a home where they feel safe, accepted, valued, supported, and part of a family. Foster carers play a pivotal role in a child's life, often making a profound difference in their development, emotional well-being, and educational achievements. Fostering is not without its challenges, tears and laughter. It requires commitment, flexibility, a sense of humour, resilience and a deep understanding of the complex issues that many foster children have experienced.

The process of becoming a **foster carer** is designed to ensure that prospective carers are well-equipped to meet the needs of foster children. It involves an initial enquiry, followed by an assessment process which includes checks, training, and home visits.

Once approved, foster carers are not left on their own; they receive ongoing training, financial allowances, and access to support groups and dedicated social workers – of which I am one. I work for a fostering charity - The Adolescent and Children's Trust (TACT) as their values and ethics are in line with my own. You can foster directly with the local authority or by joining a dedicated fostering agency who are able to provide 24/7 support.



Such support is vital, enabling carers to provide the best possible care for their foster children and helping them to deal with any challenges that arise.

Fostering can be immensely fulfilling, offering unique moments that enrich the lives of both the child and the foster parent. From witnessing a child's first moments of genuine happiness to celebrating their achievements and helping them rebuild trust in others, these experiences are priceless. Most foster parents describe their role as one of the most rewarding experiences of their lives.

Fostering not only changes the lives of foster children but can also enrich the lives of foster carers, their wider family and friends. Working with foster carers and the young people in their care certainly enriches my life and reminds me every day how transformative unconditional love can be.

The challenges of **fostering** are real, as are the profound impacts it can have on a child's life. The need for more foster homes continues to rise, and the call goes out to individuals and families to consider **fostering**. In doing so, they will change the lives of the children they welcome into their homes and also discover a deeply rewarding and life-changing experience themselves.

I am more than happy to speak with anyone interested in discovering more.

I made friends at the **Oasis Café** and more recently in **Barnsley town centre** where the indoor market stallholders have been very friendly. I've made connections with more than one **'Churches Together'** group and met some wonderful Godly people.

All in all, it's been a privilege to be here. It is a very special place with some very Godly and spiritual people doing lots of wonderful work connecting church and community to the glory of God. As John Wesley said, 'the best of all is, God is with us.'
