WORSHIP

The Church exists to increase awareness of God's presence and to celebrate God's love, and during 2024 to 2027 the Circuit will ...

Encourage each Church to provide widely accessible opportunities to encounter God across its chapels through a variety of styles, locations and times, and to encourage its people to take advantage of this variety, by

- Inviting each Church Council to arrange at least 3 worship opportunities each year offering alternative styles, locations, times or days
- Continuing to improve the sharing of details of opportunities through the Circuit website, weekly "What's On", Facebook and quarterly Newsletter
- Arranging opportunities and resources for Churches, chapels, Worship Leaders and Local Preachers about alternative styles and ways of worshipping
- Arranging training for Local Preachers, Worship Leaders and others who wish to lead worship, study groups or other online activities

Encourage and promote a rich prayer life throughout the Circuit's Churches, chapels and individuals, by

Providing a Circuit prayer diary of prayer resources and suggestions, both online and in a booklet

Enable its people to explore a calling to local preaching or worship leading, and provide appropriate training and resources to support them, by

- Providing an event for anyone interested in finding out more about being a Worship Leader or Local Preacher
- * Holding **Worship Leaders courses** in the first year and as required
- Providing a short session to encourage and enable existing Local Preachers to act as mentors to new Local Preachers and Worship Leaders

The Church exists to help people grow and learn as Christians, through mutual support and care, and in 2024 to 2027 the Circuit will ...

Provide opportunities for its people to explore their faith and discipleship, by

- Arranging Circuit-wide opportunities for people to explore and strengthen their faith and calling through courses such as Alpha
- Arranging Bible Study and Fellowship Groups during Advent and Lent each year, and at other times where appropriate
- Developing study, worship and activities to enable the relaunch of the Methodist Way of Life in the Circuit

Encourage, support and equip its people for growth, nurture and leadership, by

- Reviewing the work and opportunities of each Church's nurture and pastoral care workers and other lay workers
- Appointing a Circuit minister with responsibility for growth, nurture and discipleship from September 2025 for three years
- Identifying opportunities and support needed within Churches and Chapels and providing appropriate resources
- Providing learning resources to promote and encourage exploration of what it means to be a member

Use its human and financial resources to encourage and equip its Churches to engage in mission, by

- Continuing to make available £15,000 annually to allocate in small grants to Churches which identify projects to help them engage in mission, and to maintain a Mission Fund for larger projects
- Organising occasional events to provide challenge and inspiration about mission opportunities

Encourage its people to respond to issues of social justice and engage with local and global communities, by

- * Making Joint Public Issues Team resources regularly available
- Providing worship and study session resources on social justice themes for chapels and preachers

Promote cross-Circuit initiatives, such as by supporting local foodbanks, charities and committing to becoming an Eco Circuit, by

- Identifying the requirements to become an EcoCircuit, providing resources and training to enable Churches and the Circuit to fulfil them
- Maintaining the commitment to Fairtrade status of Churches and the Circuit, and ensuring compliance with the requirements
- Identifying at least one initiative each year which the Circuit, Churches and chapels could support, in addition to encouraging continued support of Foodbanks, Warm Welcomes, All We Can, and other causes

Raising awareness across the Circuit of opportunities for service and engagement, especially through external groups seeking to meet the needs of local people, by

- Providing space in each Circuit Newsletter for one Church or the Circuit Leadership Team to focus on their work seeking to meet local needs
- Providing news in each Circuit Newsletter focussing on one of the four strands of this Mission Plan
- Sharing information through the Circuit's various means of communication about local groups in need of volunteers, help and support

Provide opportunities for people on the fringes of the Church to explore questions of spirituality, faith and discipleship, by

- Providing opportunities and resources to help chapels offer a positive invitation to people and to be genuinely welcoming
- Sharing across the Circuit positive and encouraging information about events and initiatives

Continue to promote, resource and develop the use of social media to engage and communicate across the Circuit and with a wider audience, by

- Reviewing and developing current Circuit social media activity to raise the community profile of chapel activities
- * Encouraging the **sharing of local good news** in worship services
- Arranging training for those interested in the development of this communication, and encouraging their further involvement

Support its Churches to identify and engage with "missing generations", e.g. children and young people, adults of working age, men, culturally diverse communities, by

Reviewing the extent across the Circuit of current activity reaching out to "missing generations", and encouraging new work where needed
